Monday was a revision day for Year 10-13 students and their mock examinations are now in full flow. #### Mock examinations

Mock examinations began on Wednesday of this week. Lessons will resume as follows

- Year 10: Thursday 17th January.\*
- Year 11: Wednesday 23rd January.
- Years 12 & 13: Wednesday 16th January.

\*Year 10 ICT practical examinations will take place during the morning of 17th January. All other Year 10 will be in lessons.

Examinations results will be published shortly thereafter.

### Student Identity Cards

Students wear ID badges at all times. These are essential in managing the security of our campus and even more important in student minds because it lets them have lunch! If a student has lost their ID badge a new one can be requested by parents through the Registrar's office at a cost of 1500 Naira.

## Hair and Uniform

The recent holiday and, I suspect, for some, various social events has meant that a number of students have returned with hair styles that are not in keeping with the school uniform code. Students have been asked that by Monday 14th January their hair styles meet the rules below.

Girls' hair should not be overly long and extensions should never be longer than shoulder length. All hair must be tidy, of a single natural hair colour and tied back at all times.

Boys' hair must be short but not too closely shaven or have shapes cut into it. All students are expected to be without facial hair.

A school's reputation is hard won and easily lost. Uniform is a key indicator of the standards expected elsewhere within a school. I ask all students to recognise that if they do not adhere to the uniform policy it will have a negative impact on the way that the whole school community is viewed.

#### After school revision programme for Year 11 students

Period 6 (2.45-3.35) revision sessions for Year 11 students will begin shortly after the mock examinations. Lessons will start on Monday 28th January (Week B) and will continue for the rest of the term.

On Monday 14th January an electronic form will be sent via email asking all parents (boarding and day) to select which revision classes they wish their sons and daughters to participate in. Should you have difficulties accessing this form then paper copies are available from the Registrars office. Returns should be made by Monday 21st January.

#### **Co-Curricular** Activities

Co-Curricular activities will begin week beginning Monday 14th January. Years 7-10 and 12-13 are encouraged to take full advantage of the range of activities available to them. Year 11 will not participate in afternoon activities as they will shortly embark on their after school revision programme.

Currently many of our Year 11 have gained entry and some also scholarships for several of the best Sixth Forms in the UK.
